The Government has published guidance and supporting materials on information sharing, which have been updated to apply to those working with adults as well as with children and young people.

Widely endorsed by charities, governing bodies and professional organisations, the **guidance offers clarity on how to share information legally and professionally**, whichever sector you work in. It also outlines how organisations can promote and support good practice.

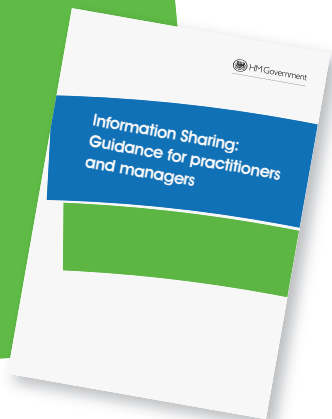
